MOTHER'S DAY SERMON

Being a Mother is tough. It's not for the faint of heart. It's the greatest and most rewarding privilege there is. But it's still difficult. Today God's message is going to give all of you- whether you are a mother or not- some encouragement. Today you are going to be receiving a Mother's Day card from God. If God sent you a card from heaven, what would it say? If God decided to speak directly to every mother in the world, what are the two or three things He would be sure to mention? I think He would start by saying: you don't have to be perfect to be a mother.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE PERFECT TO BE A MOTHER. On the average:

- Two million documents are lost each year by the IRS.
- 22,000 checks are deducted from the wrong bank account every hour.
- 18,322 pieces of mail are mishandled by the Post Office each and every hour.
- 107 incorrect medical procedures will be performed by the end of the day today.
- 315 entries in Webster's Third New International Dictionary of the English Language will turn out to be misspelled.

Nothing in this world is perfect. And that includes being a mother. Having said that the greatest power on earth is this: A MOTHER'S LOVE.

Mother Teresa said "the poorest of the poor are those who feel they are unloved."

A mother's love is the most powerful force on earth. It can cover a multitude of wrongs.

I have always found it difficult to know how to strike the right balance on Mother's Day. For some it brings to mind difficult times. It is a reminder of the loss of their mother. For others it brings back memories of mothering that are painful. For some biological motherhood wasn't possible. For some the death of a child remains overwhelming.

Amazon.com lists over 50,000 books about Mothers. Facebook has over 113,000,000 pages about mothers. And of course, Instagram, Myspace and Snap-chat get bombarded on this day with mother day messages. This is the day Hallmark lives for.

While motherhood brings with it all manner of stumbling blocks, pitfalls and broken dreams, it is still the purest love our world will ever know. In spite of all the messy diapers, soiled wallpaper and spoiled plans, the love of a mother remains a beautiful thing. Motherhood is a natural part of God's creative plan to bring love and caring into this world. Motherhood is God's plan.

G.K. Chesterton asked: "Can anyone tell me two things more vital to the human race than these; what man will marry what woman and what will be the first things they teach their children." What a child learns on their mother's knee goes with them throughout their lives.

Some of you have children that are long grown up. But you never stop being a mother. Every mother lives her life for another. Those of you who are mothers- for the love of having a child- have experienced the pain of labor. For the love of your child, you massively reduced your social life. For the love of your child, you structured your entire day around their needs and activities. Every mother lives her life for another.

William Busch said: "To become a mother is not so difficult; on the other hand, being a mother is very much so!"

We are not all mothers and there are many other forms of self-sacrifice. We are all called- in the name of Christ- to give up ourselves in service to others. But mothers are an inspiration to the rest of us. Every mother exists not for her own benefit but for the benefit of her children.

Is that not also the picture of the Christ? Sacrificial love.

This is a lesson that we all need to learn. We need to learn more and more to exist not for our own benefit but for the benefit of others. As parents, we do things we don't want to, but we do them anyway because we love our child. That's a God given calling for all of us.

In Hebrew the word for "**compassion**" comes from the root word for, "**womb.**" The picture is of a birthing. Something new is being born. If we apply this to the human experience, it means that our compassionate acts always give the other person another chance. We don't hold past failures against them. We offer a "fresh start."

We want this from others. Are we willing to give it to them? Such compassion will dramatically change the way we relate to each other. Sacrificial love changes people.

Kahlil Gibran remarked, "We can forget those with whom we have laughed, but we can never forget those with whom we have cried." Sacrificial love feels what the other feels, hurts where the other hurts and cries where the other cries.

Even if you aren't a Mother, maybe you know of someone who could use some words of encouragement today. Discouragement can come at any time. It can come:

- When your kids act up and do the same silly things you've told them over and over again not to do.
- When you can't get a break from their sicknesses or accidents or both.
- When you feel an emotional distance growing between you and them.
- When you feel like your husband isn't helping you as much as he should.
- When others look down on you because of the way you choose to parent.

Discouragement can be a very real force in a Mother's life. When that discouragement comes and tries to steal your joy, remember that God is with you. He will help you with what He has called you to do. When it comes to children adults must be encouragers.

A study was done by psychologist Dr. Henry H. Goddard, on energy levels in children. He found that when tired children are given a word of praise or encouragement, they show an immediate upward surge of new energy. When children are criticized and discouraged` their physical energy take a sudden nose-dive.

People are always more encouraged when we share how God's grace can help them in their weakness. Positive outweighs negative every time.

Listen to what God says in Isaiah 41:10. "So do not fear for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

God is here and will help you to be the Mother- or if you are not a mother- the person- He's called you to be. God is a God of encouragement in the midst of discouragement.

But not only must you deal with discouragement. There is also frustration. The best of parents can become frustrated with their children. Children, at times, can be difficult to get along with.

A little boy was sitting on his front steps with his face cradled in his hands, looking forlorn. His dad came home just then and asked him what was wrong. The little boy looked up and said, "Well, just between us, Dad, I'm having trouble getting along with your wife."

Some mothers get upset by the smallest of things.

- "Are you telling me that you used my eyeliner to draw a picture on the wall?"
- "You did what to the cat?"
- "Why did you try and cut your own hair?"
- "Son, you know you can't wear the same underwear for a week!"

When you get upset, frustrated, or are tempted to get angry remember Ephesians 4:26-27: "In your anger do not sin. Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foothold."

Emotions that are out of control can give Satan an opportunity to drive a wedge in your family relationships. They can create emotional scars that can take a long time to heal. Frustration, disappointment, and discouragement are all at times the normal response to a given situation but we must let God help us control those emotions instead of allowing them to control us.

If you lose control of yourself with your kids, for something they do wrong, do you wait for them to apologize to you or do you set the example and go to them?

Sometimes it's hard to know what to do. So many decisions need to be made. Important, life-changing and life-altering decisions. Questions about our children's education, our children's moral issues, health concerns, paying for college, when they should start dating and all other kinds of things. Things as simple as, "How can I get my kids to go through one day without fighting?" Or things as crucial as, "How can I help my kids understand that God loves them even when life is hard."

Always remember, God will give you the wisdom you need to be the best you can be. James 1:5 reads. "If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him."

Mothering is tiring. Parenting is tiring. Just plain living the Christian life is tiring. Does what we do make any difference at all? Are we even making a contribution to the betterment of this world?

ls. 40:29-31 reads: "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint."

Our God wants to give you the strength to do all that you need to do. So, when your strength is failing, and there's nobody around to give you a break, rely on our all-powerful God who will give you the strength to carry on.

Lastly, what does God have to say to us when we are worried? Mothers tend to worry because they care so much about their kids. They laugh when their kids laugh. They cry when their kids cry. They hurt when their kids fail. They rejoice when their kids' triumph. Moms want their kids to have the best and be the best.

But sometimes Moms worry when things don't go as planned. Sometimes Moms worry when they see problems and pain coming for their children. Worry comes when things seem like they're out of our control and going badly.

But remember: you don't have to be the perfect Mom for your kids to turn out okay. You can and will make mistakes. Trying to be the perfect Mom isn't a realistic goal. But what you can be is the Mom that God's enabled you to be. Don't compare yourself with your neighbor. Don't compare yourself with someone you saw on TV or someone you read about in a book. Be the Mom God's created you to be. Do your best, and leave the results up to Him. And when worry comes, remember Philippians 4:6-7: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

When you're worried, go to God who will calm your heart and give you peace. We can go to Him when we feel discouraged, when we feel angry, when we need wisdom, when we feel alone, when we feel tired and when we feel worried. Being a Mother is a high calling. God will help you as you seek to love your children into adulthood. God is here for you! God is with us and will help us with life if we'll simply have faith. Amen!
